GREEN RIVER ICE WARNING

The Village of Morrisville Water and Light Department is warning all persons planning to use Green River Reservoir for winter recreation that, due to the Department's use of the water for power generation, there can be a gap between the ice and actual reservoir water level of up to 10 feet. Persons going out on the ice should only do so with extreme caution.

GREEN RIVER HYDRO UPDATE

The Green River Reservoir and its State Park is a special place for Vermonters, anglers, paddlers and the wildlife that make it home. MW&L recognizes and greatly appreciates the value of this unique place. Unfortunately, due to Vermont Agency of Natural Resources Water Quality Certificate conditions on our hydroelectric generators, we will no longer be able to economically operate the dam.

Recognizing the impossible financial reality of continuing to operate the dam as well as the value of the reservoir and the State Park, MW&L has formally asked the State of Vermont to purchase the Green River Reservoir dam. By doing so the state would be able to avoid decommissioning and preserve both the reservoir and its park. In the months ahead the state will be performing a dam safety assessment analysis to help determine how they will proceed. We are hopeful that they will ultimately decide to purchase the dam and preserve the reservoir and the park.

DON'T FLUSH IT

Just a reminder for all MW&L customers connected to the sewer system, we do our best to keep and maintain the sewer collection system so clogs and backup don't adversely affect our customers. The pumps in these stations are designed to handle water, human waste, and tissue paper only. Clogged pumps and sewer lines lead to sewer backups which can back up into homes and are expensive to clean and repair.

UTILITY REBATES & INSTANT DISCOUNT

Vermont Public Power Supply Authority (VPPSA) announced that member utility customers can get an instant price cut when they purchase or lease an electric vehicle from a participating dealership. The discount is a new offering in VPPSA's rebate program designed to reduce fossil fuel consumption.

VPPSA member customers can get:

- • \$1,000 for a new all-electric vehicle
- \$500 for a new plug-in hybrid
- \$500 for a used all-electric vehicle
- \$250 for a used plug-in hybrid

Income-qualifying customers can receive an additional \$400 for a new electric vehicle or plug-in hybrid.
